(Boys of Bluehill / Soldier's Joy / Staten Island Hornpipe)

A set of some of the oldest hornpipe tunes in the Fiddler's repertoire.

Boys of Bluehill - a hornpipe, nominally Irish, although it's roots are so old as to become indeterminate.

Soldier's Joy - one of the oldest and most widely-distributed tunes in the English-speaking world, the title probably refers to either money, booze or drugs.

Staten Island Hornpipe - Like many old-time tunes, this one has many names. In Donegal, it is known as The Arranmore Ferry .
